

## 2012 MG Technical Regulations - Summary of Changes

*Mens Commission, Monday, 7 November 2011*

Part B of the Gymnastics Australia Men's Technical Regulations outlines the rules, regulations and processes that are used to conduct competitive Men's Gymnastics within Australia. These regulations are reviewed on an ongoing basis for relevance, compliance and to ensure transparency. Part B of the Technical Regulations is reviewed each year after the Australian Championships in consultation with State Technical Directors or appointed representatives at the Gymnastics Australia Advisory meeting which was held in August earlier this year.

The Men's Commission have finalised the Technical Regulations that will govern Men's Gymnastics throughout 2012. The following are a summary of changes to the MG Technical Regulations for 2012.

This is a guide only and should be used only to direct your attention to sections of the actual document. Changes to formatting or phrasing are not included in this summary.

- Article 3.1.2          National Coach added to National Advisory Committee
- Article 5.7.1          New Qualification Scores for Australian Championships.
- Article 5.7.1          Changes to rules regarding additional gymnasts competing at Australian Championships and nomination of these "Competing Reserve Gymnasts".
- Article 5.7.5          GA policy on sponsorship will affect uniforms worn by gymnasts at Australian Championships.
- Article 5.7.6          Changes to awards at Australian Championships.
- Article 5.7.12        Wood insert in vault runway to be used for Level 10 competition if available.
- Article 5.9            Changes to Rules for MG National Club Championships.
- Article 6.4.10        Changes to Categories of International Competitions for Points System for Calculating Awards for Gymnasts.
- Article 6.4.11        Changes to Categories of International Competitions for Points System for Calculating Awards for International Coaches
