Leigh Oswin and Jack Penny recently attended the FIG Continental Judging Course for Trampoline Gymnastics at the Australian Institute of Sport in Canberra. The course was presented by FIG Technical Committee member Vladamir Zemen. Leigh and Jack along with 16 other Australians and 6 New Zealanders slaved over the code of points, technical regulations and apparatus norms for three days and after the stress of written and practical exams have successfully walked away with new FIG Brevets for the 2013-2016 cycle.

This was Jack's first crack at the continental course, and with a strong history as an international athlete flew through with ease picking up brevet IV results in trampoline, double mini and tumbling.

This was Leigh's second continental judging course after achieving category IV in the 2009-2012 cycle, Leigh's results came in at brevet II standard and his international judging assignments over the previous cycle will now be analysed by FIG to determine if he is awarded brevet III or II.

Jack and Leigh will now be working to up-skill Tasmania's judges in the new code of points and continue delivering judge education formally and informally at GT events and courses.
