PRESIDENT'S REPORT

The 2013 year has been a year of growth for Gymnastics Tasmania with our athlete membership increasing from 3,500 in 2012 to 4,500 in 2013. I would like to thank Gymnastics Tasmania's staff and most importantly Gymnastics Tasmania's affiliated clubs, coaches and officials for this outstanding increase in membership.

At a Board level we have been very busy undertaking a governance review and completing our Strategic Plan for the next four years. The governance review has been led by Leigh Oswin who has done an exceptional job in this area and we would like to thank him for his work with this and support throughout 2013. I would like to thank Sport and Recreation Tasmania for their assistance in developing a Strategic Plan which included club meetings in the three regions of Tasmania. I believe we have a strong Strategic Plan that links in with Gymnastics Australia and I look forward to working with Gymnastics Tasmania's administration in implementing the Operational Plan.

During 2013 a review of the partnership between Gymnastics Tasmania and Gymnastics Australia for the provision of administration to its Members was undertaken. A model was put forward by Gymnastics Australia which was approved by our Board for an additional three years. I would like to thank Mark Rendell and the staff at Gymnastics Australia for their hard work in this area.

I would like to recognise and thank Jane Johnston for her work over the past three years in her role as Club 10 Development Officer. Jane will be moving onto a roll as Club Development Officer with Hobart Gymnastics Academy and I wish her well in this position.

With the support of Sport and Recreation Tasmania, Peter Doody and I prepared a Tasmanian Facility Strategy, involving the input of fifteen of a possible sixteen Tasmanian Clubs. This resource identified a need in Tasmania for more and improved gymnastics facilities. Using parts of the resource, Zodiacs Gymnastics Club was successful in receiving funding from the Federal Government to extend their current facility.

Gymnastics Tasmania has once again shown outstanding performance at National Championships. Trampoline continued their strong representation with Hugh McConnell becoming Junior Champion in Trampoline and Synchronised Trampoline. The Women's Artistic gymnasts produced their best result ever at a National Championship with Camille O'Connor becoming Level 7 Vault Champion and three other gymnasts coming home with medals. The Men's team continued their strong showing with Daniel Bell placing second overall in Level 8 with the other gymnasts placing well in their first National Championships.

I would like to congratulate Jack Penny, Hugh McConnell and Coach, Ben Kelly on their outstanding results at the Trampoline World Championships. Although Jack was

unable to compete due to an ankle injury, he was a part of the team that placed 3rd on Trampoline. Hugh placed 3rd in Double-Mini in the 15-16 year age group.

Finally I would like to thank both Davina and Ludmilla for their services to the Board. Davina has been with us for a short time but has been valuable in her support and guidance to the board. Ludmilla has been a long time board member of Gymnastics Tasmania, who has seen the board through some very difficult times, her contribution to the Gymnastics Tasmania Board and the sport of gymnastics has been enormous and has assisted the sport to become what we are today.

CLUB 10 REPORT

Throughout 2013 the Club Development Officer continued to build relationships with each club. Spending time and communicating with the Club personnel enabled the Club Development Officer to have a better understanding of the challenges that clubs face, and where assistance could be best given. With the new coach's framework being rolled out, communication was vital to help coaches and clubs have an understanding around the changes and to assist them where ever possible.

Affiliation

The affiliation process ran smoothly in 2013, with the majority of clubs returning forms in a timely manner. All clubs had their affiliation paperwork emailed through to their club email address as well as a hardcopy being posted out to the clubs. Using both methods was very successful as all clubs returned their forms this year, unlike previous years where forms may have needed to be resent.

Membership

The majority of 2013 membership packages were distributed in time for the commencement of classes for 2013. Due to prior planning the membership packs were distributed to all the clubs who had a representative at the Congress. If the club didn't attend the Congress the packs were posted out early February.

Membership numbers at each club showed great growth throughout 2013, a number of clubs reached a milestone of 500 memberships, which was pleasing to see.

Club 10 Developments

The Club 10 Quality Assurance Program re-developments were placed on hold throughout 2013, due to Gymnastics Australia needing to concentrate their resources on the coach's framework roll out. 2014 will hopefully see the development of this new program get underway again. All clubs were asked to continue to update and modify their policies and procedures where necessary throughout 2013. All clubs retained their current star rating and no audits were carried out in 2013.

MEN'S ARTISTIC GYMNASTICS REPORT

Open Levels Tour

Gymnastics Tasmania had two gymnasts compete successfully in the Vitaly Scherbo Invitational in January: Daniel Bell at Level 8 and Brady Lillico at Level 9.

Daniel placed 1st on Parallel Bars and 3rd on High Bar. Brady Lillico placed 3rd on Vault. The Level 8 Team placed 3rd overall and the Level 9 Team placed 2nd.

In October we had two gymnasts and one coach selected for the New Zealand Nationals: Matthew Rose, Daniel Bell and Coach, Kodee Voss.

Matthew was competing as part of the Level 7 team. He placed 6th overall. The Level 7 Team finished in 2nd place. Daniel was competing as a Level 8 athlete and Kodee was the coach for the Level 8 Team. Daniel placed 1st Overall, 2nd on Floor and Rings, 3rd on Vault and 1st on Parallel Bars and High Bar. The Team finished in 1st place.

Australian Championships

Gymnastics Tasmania had five gymnasts selected for the 2013 Australian Championships:

Daniel Bell - Level 8

Cooper Wilson and Matthew Rose – Level 7

Oliver Dalco and Oliver Lohrey – Level 6 Under 12 Years

Daniel placed 2nd Overall, 3rd on Rings and 3rd on High Bar.

Head Coach was Kodee Voss with Thomas Osborn taking the role of Head Judge, Mark Moncur was Team Manager, and Philippa Lohrey and Rachael Dalco were chaperones.

State Events

Overall these events were run well with over eight events held across the state.

A new style of event was introduced for gymnasts in Levels 0-2. This was called the Grand Prix Event Series. There were three events held with over 20 gymnasts competing at each event. The number of gymnasts in Levels 3-10 has declined however participation in Levels 0-2 has increased from last year.

State Development Squad

A new initiative with twenty-three gymnasts selected for the squad. These gymnasts represented five different clubs in Levels 2-5. There were two sessions held, one at

Hobart Gymnastics Academy and one at Zodiacs Gymnastics Club. Lars Becker led the squad delivering a focus on presentation in skill work.

Judging

One of the challenges for Tasmania will be strengthening judge numbers in more clubs. Over the next twelve months it would be great to see a method developed to encourage all clubs to provide judges of a suitable standard. There is a necessity for an Advanced course to be held in the state to increase our numbers from one.

National Events

The Tasmanian State Team had the most successful trip ever to Nationals.

Well done to all the gymnasts who competed at the Australian Championships. The gymnasts who qualified for the event were:

Camille O'Connor - Level 7

The Level 7 team competed very well, their vaults were outstanding, and they are the Level 7 Australian Champions on Vault as a team. Well done to Camille O'Connor who won bronze on Vault at Level 7 and placed eighth Overall. Grace Gaby also medalled with bronze on Vault. At Level 8, Georgina Osborn, was the sole representative from Tasmania and made finals on Vault and Bars, winning Bronze on Vault. In Level 10, Olivia Burnett did an amazing Floor routine to win Bronze on this apparatus.

All the girls came away with personal bests which was a great achievement. Thanks to Coaches; Dan, Leah & Josh, Team Manager/Judge Mark, as well as Chaperones Fiona and Wendy for accompanying the WAG State Team.

State Events

The Tasmanian Championships were run differently in 2013 with the Senior Tasmanian Championships moved to before National Championships. The reasoning behind this decision was to allow a good lead up of events into Nationals for Women's and Men's Artistic as well as Trampoline Gymnastics. Although there were some issues around finance, coach feedback was very good and the results from Nationals also support this.

State events overall were run well by clubs that tendered with over nine Women's Artistic Gymnastics competitions being hosted by clubs. The trend over the past three years has seen a decline in the number of gymnasts participating in National Levels, this has been offset by a larger increase in gymnasts participating at State Levels.

Judging

Qualified Advanced judges in Tasmania continue to be low in numbers; however the Sport Management Committee has not deemed it cost effective to run an Advanced course in 2013 or 2014, due to the fact that significant changes will be implemented nationally from 2015, in which all judges will be required to re-do their relevant courses.

Coaching

Gymnastics Tasmania Congress in January 2013 welcomed Michelle De Highden who ran four workshops. Each of the topics she delivered were well attended and received from participants

Michelle also took State training and was able to impart much knowledge and years of experience to both coaches and gymnasts. The feedback received was very positive.

RHYTHMIC GYMNASTICS REPORT

The Sport Management Committee has worked hard with clubs to develop a positive, friendly and cohesive vibe. The result has been fantastic - judges supporting new clubs, sharing of knowledge and skills between coaches and a very positive and encouraging atmosphere at competitions and gradings.

The standard of Rhythmic Gymnastics in Tasmania has improved. Our athletes are more physically prepared and the quality of their routines has increased, there's also been an improvement in scoring. All of this is as a result of the coaches and athletes hard work within their club, determination to excel and achieve, striving for nothing less than personal excellence and success.

The introduction of the new manual has seen a few challenges – but ones that from a coaching side will be easily overcome. The manual has some exciting, fresh ideas that will benefit both coaches and athletes.

Whilst coach numbers are low in Rhythmic Gymnastics, it's essential that we keep these coaches stimulated and supported with Congresses on an annual rather than biannual basis. Coaches are inspired and have a new wave of energy and motivation to take their coaching to the next level.

The next twelve months could potentially see the introduction of a State Squad-style development group. This will be a big step forward for Rhythmic Gymnastics within the state and one which we are very much looking forward too.

We are also looking forward to the introduction of a Rhythmic Gymnastics specialist club – Spectrum Gymnastics in Kingston. We wish the club all the best with their set up.

TRAMPOLINE GYMNASTICS REPORT

2013 was another exciting year for Trampoline in Tasmania with a number of gymnasts competing regionally, domestically, and internationally at a variety of events.

The year kicked off with two Tasmanian gymnasts, Aidan Collins and Hugh McConnell, representing Australia at the Australian Youth Olympic Festival held at Sydney Olympic Park in January. Launceston's Aidan Collins was Tasmania's stand out performer at this event securing a finals berth in the Individual Trampoline, as well as a silver medal in the Synchronised event with Dominic Clark from New South Wales. Ben Kelly was also appointed Assistant Coach for this competition.

A team of twenty-four gymnasts were selected from a variety of selection events to represent Tasmania in Trampoline Gymnastics at the 2013 Australian Gymnastics Championships. The team was led by State Coach, Ben Kelly, and hauled in a total of four gold medals, two silver medals, and nine bronze medals. The gold medals were won in the Junior International Men's Trampoline (Hugh McConnell), Junior International Men's Synchronised (Hugh McConnell & Blake Rutherford/QLD), 17+ Men's Synchronised Trampoline (Aidan Collins & Hugh McConnell), and Under 11 Women's Synchronised Trampoline (Lucy Chesterman & Amber French). Tasmania also qualified for the Team's Final in both the Men's Trampoline finishing in 4th place and the Men's Double Mini Trampoline Team, which finished in 3rd place. Jo Penny attended as Team Manager for this tour, with Leigh Oswin being selected as the Head Judge for Tasmania.

Four Tasmanian clubs took part in the 2013 National Club Levels Championships which was held at the Sleeman Sports Complex in Brisbane in August. There were many finalist and medals earned from this event, with gold medals for Fergus Shepherd (Kingborough) in the Level 4 Men's Double Mini Trampoline, Patrick Schluter (Apex) in the Level 5 Men's Trampoline, Matthew French (Kingborough) in the Level 6 Men's Trampoline and Double Mini Trampoline, and Makonnen Brown (Launceston) in the Level 8 Men's Double Mini Trampoline.

This event was preceded by a World Championships and World Age Championships Trial event where gymnasts from three Tasmanian clubs were represented. Based on the results from this event and other selection events the following Tasmanian gymnasts were selected to represent Australia at the 2013 World Championships and World Age Championships in Sofia, Bulgaria;

- Jack Penny (Apex), Senior Men's Individual, Men's Team, and Synchronised Trampoline
- Hugh McConnell (Apex), Under 17 Men's Individual, Synchronised, and Double-Mini Trampoline
- Makonnen Brown (Launceston), Under 17 Men's Double Mini Trampoline

- Joshua Hedley-Williams (Launceston), Under 15 Men's Double Mini Trampoline

In addition, three Tasmanian officials were also selected for the team, including Jo Penny (Team Manager and Head of Delegation), Ben Kelly (Assistant Coach National Team and National Age Team), and Leigh Oswin (Trampoline Judge, World Age Championships). Results from the World Championships are below:

- Jack Penny – 3rd place Men's Team event (injured for qualifications and finals)
- Hugh McConnell – 3rd place U17 Men's Double Mini Trampoline; 7th U17 Synchronised Trampoline; 17th U17 Trampoline
- Makonnen Brown – 17th place U17 Men's Double Mini Trampoline

Jack Penny and Aidan Collins were selected to for the Men's Team events but could not accept their positions due to time and financial constraints. Doctor Maggie Smolinski was selected as team medical for this tour and travelled with the Australian contingent to Auckland for this tour.

Tasmania also held a series of domestic events, including two Interclub competitions, two State Championships (Age/International and Levels) and one National Championships Qualifier event. The multi-Gymsports State Championships (Age/International) was well received, the community and the SMC would like to congratulate Kingborough Gymnastics Club on their professionalism in convening this event.

Trampoline Gymnastics look forward to another great competition season in 2014.
