## PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Once again 2009 has been a huge year for gymnastics in Tasmania.

Numbers are still increasing.

2009 has once again seen our number of athletes reach a new record with 3099 registered. The demand out there in the community for our sport is high; our challenge over the next few years will be to continue to cater for the growing numbers in our sport.

### Highlights

- Hosted the National Danish Performance team in December 2008 with performances held in both Hobart and Devonport.
- Hosting the first Auscheer event in the country and our first ever Auscheer state championships
- Jack Penny being named Senior Trampoline Athlete of the year and representing Australia at the World Championships
- Trampoline is accepted into the TIS as a recognized program
- The \$2.25million State Gymnastics Centre is nearing completion with classes due to start in January 2010
- Continued growth of the Girls State Stream program
- Our largest State Championships in many years with teams from Victoria and Northern territory attending

I would also like to recognize a few individuals who have put in an exceptional amount of work during the year ensuring the gymsports they are involved with continue to grow: Ben Kelly, Jo Penny, Anke Moncur, Nicole Colev and John Hargreaves.

We are continuing to reestablish the finances of the association, and next year we will come to the end of our 3 year funding agreement with Sport and Recreation. It will be essential that we do everything we can to maintain, if not increase our support from Sport and Recreation to continue to move the sport forward.

At the end of this year, Brian and Suellen Skinner who have been involved heavily in the Trampoline community will be heading back to South Australia. I would like to thank them both for their hard work and effort over the past 5 years.

I would like to thank the Directors, Staff, Committee Members and Volunteers that have helped Gymnastics Tasmania move forward this year.

## COACHING DIRECTOR REPORT

### Level 1 Courses

### Level 2 Training

Interested candidates were able to attend Level 2 Modules provided at Coaches Congress in January. An interstate presenter was provided for these modules.

Technical member numbers continue to rise. Of the 110 technical members, 51 are coaches, 38 are coaches and judges and 22 are judges.

### Coaches Congress

This year's Congress followed the same format as previously, with streams for MAG, WAG, RG and TRP, each with its own presenter. The Coaches workshops were held on the Saturday followed by training clinics on the Sunday.

The event was well attended and well received with over 65 members attending and it is intended to continue with this format.



## **CLUB 10 OFFICER'S REPORT**

2009 has seen the consolidation of the Club 10 role within Tasmania with services accessed by a significant number of clubs throughout the state. A range of activities to support the state association have been undertaken through out the year and I would like to extend my gratitude towards the staff at Gymnastics Australia and Gymnastics Tasmania who have supported my various tasks and activities.

### **Affiliation**

The affiliation process continues to run smoothly with the majority of clubs returning forms completed albeit slightly outside the deadline. I am currently working on compiling an affiliation package for 2010 that further highlights the benefits clubs will gain as a result of their affiliation with Gymnastics Tasmania.

### **Membership**

The PCYCT Agreement is in the process of being renegotiated for 2010. A proposal has been tabled with the PCYC group and we are waiting on feedback from the PCYC due to a change over of staff that will occur early in 2010

2009 membership packages were all distributed in time for the commencement of classes for 2009. The change to the packages was well received by all and it is intended to continue in this manner for future years.

### **Star Categories**

Our clubs maintained their star ratings this year. Devonport Gymnastics Club, Wild Cats Gymnastics Club and Jumping Jacks Trampoline Club have all made progress towards achieving star 3 and I hope this will continue through out 2010.

### **Policies and Procedures**

The constitution has been reviewed and has been adopted. A new strategic plan has also been developed, approved and adopted. Review of policies and procedures has occurred as required.

### **Calendar**

A new process for producing the 2010 calendar was trialed this year with a request sent to disciplines to electronically submit their calendar which I then collated and sent out as a draft for feedback in an effort to minimize clashes between disciplines which have become inevitable as the variety of event offered by Gymnastics Tasmania has increased. One flaw in the process so far has been receiving dates from all disciplines involved requiring a fair amount of follow up work to be conducted.

### **Grant Activities**

As the Sport and Recreation Tasmania grant was successful in 2008 in achieving triennial funding, it was not necessary to write a full submission in 2009. I have been involve in filling out progress reports for the grant at regular intervals as requested by SRT. We are currently a tier two funded organization. I have also been looking at the criteria to allow Gymnastics Tasmania to apply for tier one funding when the next grant submission is required. Basically an increase in membership and the development of a formal Disability Action Plan are the main goals to allow this to occur.

I have not submitted any other grant applications on behalf of Gymnastics Tasmania this year.

After the well attended event in 2008, it was disappointing to have to cancel the Hobart Novice Event and Level 2 to 5 Invitational Competition due to lack of entries. It is assumed that the lack of interest is due to the club invitational competitions held in Hobart.

Once again a team of gymnasts entered the PIT Invitational Competition in Melbourne, but were unable to win the Shield.

### State Championships

With over 50 entries from clubs around the State, there were strong contingents from Devonport and Kingborough and entries from Hobart Gymnastics Academy, Hobart PCYC and Launceston PCYC.

Kingborough took out the Shell Shield for overall champion club and individual honours were shared round.

We were fortunate to have the assistance of Paul Szyjko and John Curtin as head judges and were able to field 6 panels of judges in one session – a new milestone for men's judging in Tas. John and Paul have been big supporters of gymnastics in Tas and we greatly appreciate their input.

The Championships ran smoothly thanks to the efforts of Mark Moncur and his team from Kingborough and the computer scoring with screens displaying scores as the judges completed them greatly enhanced the competition.

## **Trans-Bass Challenge**

In conjunction with the Tasmanian Men's Championships, a Trans-Bass Challenge was introduced this year and two teams competed with a combined Tasmanian team. John Dorrington brought his usual strong contingent from PIT Gymnastics in Victoria and Andrew Martin entered a combined team from Northern Territory clubs.

PIT Gymnastics dominated the competition from levels 3 to 5 and came out overall winners with Tas second and NT third. Gymnasts from all teams won individual medals. John Dorrington received the Dorrington – Hargreaves Shield from John Hargreaves together with the Trans-Bass trophy. No doubt there will be considerable efforts from Tas to recover the Shield at the next PIT Invitational Competition in 2010.

The large team from NT greatly added to the event and Tas appreciates the support we have received in recent years from Andrew Martin.

Thanks to the judges who accompanied the teams: Ros Fleming and Satoshi Okita from PIT and Brad Davis from NT.

## **National Championships**

This year's team to Nationals comprised individuals at Level 7 U13 and Level 8 Open and a team at Level 7 Open. Team management comprised John Hargreaves and Pauline Dittmann, both of whom were also judges. Coaches were Kyle Giles and Ana McGoldrick.

All gymnasts performed well and results highlights included the Level 7 Open team 4<sup>th</sup> placing, Ricky Maui's bronze medal on parallel bars and Brady Lillico's certificate for 6<sup>th</sup> place on vault.

Most of the gymnasts have now been to a number of National Championships and they have represented the State with great merit, both on the gym floor and outside. Kyle and Pauline are very experienced officials and once again made an invaluable contribution to the event.

## **Coaches Courses & Clinics**

### **Coaches Congress**

Greg Corsiglia, the head coach from the Victorian HPC presented four MG sessions at this year's Coaches Congress. The sessions were well attended and covered a range of practical and lecture topics.

### **HGA Clinic**

Following the Congress, Greg Corsiglia ran a training clinic for the higher level gymnasts. The clinic was well received and proved to be a stimulating event to begin the year.

### **State Team Training**

A training session for the State Team to Nationals was held at HGA in June.

In summary all 3 course held were successful with a total of 14 new Level 1 Judges and 9 new Level 2 Judges within the state. A Level 3 course will not be held until 2010 to coincide with the introduction of the new cycle.

The costs of these courses are based on the information available at the time of reporting. As not all invoices had been received, some figures are estimates. The total cost of the 3 courses is estimated to be \$2655.

The following issues need to be considered:

1. Courses need to be accessible to candidates around the state. It is critical to continue to offer the Level 1 course in the North of the state. The costs of using an interstate Course Presenter are, however, almost prohibitive. Can we identify a potential course presenter within the area and train them to present this course. It may be cheaper in the long run sending this person to the mainland to attend a Course Presenter's Course.
2. Attracting candidates from Northern Clubs is an ongoing issue. This places a huge burden on Launceston PCYC and Zodiacs Gymnastics club when it comes to the Northern Regionals competition.

#### *Final update on Jessica's and Olivia's results from nationals 2009*

The 2009 Australian National Championships for WAG has concluded with solid performances from our two state representatives Jessica Carter and Olivia Burnett.

Jessica Carter competed on Wednesday the 8th in her first nationals. Her best score was on floor, with 12.525, which is also her highest score on floor of this competition season. Jess finished with an overall score of 45.150, and was particularly happy with completing the competition with no falls.

Olivia Burnett competed on Thursday and Friday in the WAG Level 9 competition. Liv was looking to improve her scores from Thursday's competition, especially on floor and bars. Her best score on day one was Vault, scoring a 14.075. On Friday Olivia was very happy with all scores, which consisted of two scores over 12.00 (bars and beam) and two scores over 14.00 (floor and vault). The overall scores are calculated over two days; her highest place was on vault at 15th out of a field of 26, and overall Liv placed 21st with a score of 102.150. Congratulations Liv!

### Competitions

Tasmanian athletes competed in a variety of local, interstate, national, and international events. The highlight being the 2009 Australian National Championships, where three Tasmanian athletes; Jack Penny (Senior International DMT), Aidan Collins Under 15 TRP, Under 15 DMT), and Natalie Skinner (Under 17 TRP) were crowned National Champions.

### International

In 2009, seven Tasmanian athletes nominated for a position on the Australian Team. Five of these athletes were chosen to represent Australia at the World Championships (11-14 November) and World Age Competition (18-22 November) in St. Petersburg, Russia. The athletes selected to represent Australia at the World Championships were Jack Penny (Senior International); and for the World Age Competition were Damien Axelsen (Under 19), Aidan Collins (Under 15), Patrick Sauerwald (Under 13), and Natalie Skinner (Under 17). Unfortunately, Damien Axelsen was unable to accept his position on the team due to a knee condition which affected his training and final preparation.

Three Tasmanian officials were also selected, Jo Penny (Open Team Manager), Leigh Oswin (Age Team, DMT Judge), and Davina Sauerwald (Age Team Chaperone). Jo Penny's selection as Open Team Manager is worthy of comment and an excellent achievement. Her expertise as Tasmanian Squad Manager has not gone unnoticed by Gymnastics Australia, entrusting her with managing Australia's best Trampoline Gymnasts, including 2008 Olympian, Ben Wilden.

### **National Championships**

Tasmania sent a record of 22 athletes to the Australian National Championships. The UTA Team once again secured the gold medal in Men's Elite Team's event, comprising of both South Australian and Tasmanian athletes. In addition to these achievements, Jack Penny was awarded the prestigious **National Athlete of the Year** for Trampoline Sports based on his results during 2008.

In regards to the day to day operation of the team, the Head of Delegation, Jo Penny, has recommended that only the Junior and Senior Championship Team travel to National Championships the Friday prior to the competition, with all Age Team Members (regardless of age division) travelling on Sunday. Furthermore, it is being recommended that only one chaperone per room will travel with the team in 2009, to help with accommodation and travel bookings.

### **Local competitions**

The State Level Championships held in Hobart in August saw an increase in entries, with a continuing increase in the Level 3 and Level 4 Women's events. The award for Overall State Champions is presented at the State Level Championships each year and is awarded to the athletes who show consistency in performance over the year in interclub, state, interstate, national, and international events.

Trampoline Sports ran three Interclubs in 2009, the third Interclub which is traditionally convened in November/December was convened in October this year, due to officials being at World Championships. Kingborough were meant to host this competition, however, due to a hold up in the construction of the new centre, this competition was convened in Launceston. Kingborough will endeavour to host the 1<sup>st</sup> Interclub of 2010. A brief summary of these championships are below.

- May, Jumping Jacks TRP Club (Levels & Elite)
  - **Number of Competitors: 87**

  - **Number of Entries: 336**

Due to the increase in competitors in Trampoline competitions it has been proposed that the Level 5/6 Synchronised competition no longer be combined. This will be reflected in the 2010 Tasmanian Competition Handbook. The mixed gender concept will continue until it is perceived there are enough male and female participants in each level to warrant a gendered split. There are no other foreseen changes being made to this Handbook.

## 2010 National Club Levels

Gymnastics Tasmania and the TAS TRP SMC put forward a bid to convene the 2010 National Club Levels Competition at the new Kingborough Sports Centre in August 2010. Despite some initial confusion regarding the proposed date of this event, GA has

confirmed GT will stage this event on the 31 July to the 1<sup>st</sup> August. The National Club Levels competition is a high profile event in the National Trampoline calendar, attracting competitors from every state. In 2010, the National Club Levels competition will be the final and compulsory trial for the 2010 Senior World Championship Team, the final trial for the Australian Age World Championship Team, and the premier event for the discipline of Tumbling.

### **State Squads & Training Camps**

The scores required for entry into the four tier Trampoline State Squad system remained unchanged in 2009 (see figure below). Given these scores are based on the Australian Proficiency Award Scheme (PAS), it is anticipated that they will change due to the 2009-2012 Code of Points.

The goal of the State Squad system is to identify potential State Team athletes for the current year, as well as to provide extra training and competition experience to help promote and develop these talents to their full potential.



In 2009, four State Squad Trainings have been conducted, including the one at the 2009 Tasmanian Congress. These trainings have a different focus depending on the squad attending and the time of the year. Each Squad Training aims to promote a balance on performance and skill development, as well as introducing some cross training, the use of recovery sessions and the importance of training diaries.

In addition to the Squad Trainings, squad members are also invited to participate in interstate events organised on a combined club basis to help share the workload and costs associated with travel and accommodation to help increase their competitiveness through experience. These competitions are selected based on the quality of the competition and matched to the athletes in the squad system. The competitions attended in 2009 included the VIC Championships, QLD Championships, NSW Championships, SA Championships, and the UTA Challenge.

In 2009, the Trampoline SMC believes they have fulfilled all goals pertaining to the State Squad system. In 2010, minor changes will be made to the Squad Trainings, most notably including all members of the Age Squad in the annual sleep-over (the older athletes have been included in the elite squad in recent years to promote transition

upwards). The Elite Squad training is being removed and the focus for this Squad will be predominantly the training at the Coaching Congress.

## **National Squads & TIS**

In 2009, Jack Penny was part of the Senior National Squad for both Individual Trampoline and Double-Mini. Jack Penny was once again successful in securing a 2009 TIS Elite Development Scholarship. Jack maintained his Elite Development Level 1 Scholarship in 2009 based on his 2008 results. The TIS have once again supported the Trampoline Sports athletes through the National Representatives Fund to assist in costs towards the World Age Competition in Russia.

Gymnastics Tasmania has submitted an application for an Elite Development Program through the TIS for 2010. This application has gone through the formal process and negotiations are currently being made with Carl Saunders regarding the feasibility of this development. The athletes recommended to the TIS to be part of any future EDP program include Jack Penny, Natalie Skinner, Damien Axelsen, Aidan Collins, and Patrick Sauerwald. The proposed TIS EDP for Trampoline Gymnastics is based on a 3-tier program with inclusion at each tier dependent on results at interstate, national, and international competitions. Individual scholarships and funding are still available to athletes within the EDP. The outcome of this proposal is not yet known.

## **Education**

In recent years Leigh Oswin has committed to the education of the Trampoline Sports community in both coaching and judging. These courses will be held every year, with the expectation that the courses will alternate around the north-south centres every year to encourage an even development.

The coaching course had 7 candidates and was hosted by Jumping Jacks Trampoline Sports Club in late May all 7 candidates are either now fully accredited or awaiting return of their workbooks.

No judging courses were run from Trampoline Sports in Tasmania for 2009 due to the change in FIG cycle and the update of Gymnastics Australia's courses. It is expected that GA will release the advanced (previously Level 3) course by the end of 2009 and this course has been scheduled for March 2010. The Beginner and Intermediate courses (previously Level 1 & Level 2) are not expected to be ready for presentation until late 2010 so it has been decided to run the old cycle Level 1 and 2 courses in 2010 to continue to encourage new judge participation and support within the sport. The expectation for candidates sitting these courses is that upon the release of the new GA courses candidates will need to reaccredit.

The FIG continental judging course was held from the 9-11<sup>th</sup> May 2009 with Tasmania sending three candidates. Jana Vitesnikova successfully upgraded her FIG Brevet from 4 to 3 on Trampoline and 3 to 2 on Double Mini, first time FIG course candidate Leigh Oswin achieved Brevet 4 in Trampoline, Tumbling and Double Mini and Jo Penny received club sponsorship to attend the course as an observer gaining a valuable insight into the new code of points for Tasmanian Trampoline Sports.



## **2010 – Looking ahead**

Finally, it is with great regret with farewell from our shores, one of our most influential member families within Tasmanian Trampoline Sports. Recently it has been announced that the Skinner family have decided to return to Adelaide for personal and family reasons. The Skinner family has been instrumental in building the profile of Trampoline Sports in Tasmania, primarily through the development of Jumping Jacks in Hobart. Through the efforts of the entire family, the Skinners have also assisted in promoting Trampoline as a whole for the state of Tasmania, both nationally and internationally. The Tasmanian Trampoline Sports SMC would like to thank Brian and Suellen Skinner for the tremendous amount of hard work dedicated to Trampoline Sports over the past 6 years. Their input will be greatly missed and on behalf of the entire community I would like to wish them well in their future endeavours.

### COACHING

Currently there are 7 accredited coaches within Tasmania, but not all are currently coaching within RG programs. Two coaches and a group of gymnasts from HGA and HPCYC attended the Rhythmic Kids Camp held at the Prahran Rhythmic Club in Victoria during January and gained a lot from this experience.

I am currently completing requirements to gain my RG Level 2 coaching accreditation, having attended the RG specific component in Victoria earlier in the year, which was made possible through gaining a Women in Sport Leadership grant.

## **JUDGING**

The lack of accredited judges within the State continues to be a major problem, having to rely on only 2 judges for every event that is held. The new judging courses are in the process of being finalized with the updates for the 2010-2013 cycle, which will finally allow us to run Beginner and Intermediate judging courses in the near future. There is still interest from the RG community for participants to attend the courses once available, so 2010 should see a considerable improvement in this area.

## **COMMENTS**

2009 has been a steady year for RG within Tasmania, with all events well attended and running smoothly. We are currently in the process of putting together a State Squad which will consist of Level 5/6 gymnasts, with the aim of improving the standard of Rhythmic gymnastics generally and working towards sending a full team of Level 7 gymnasts to Nationals in 2011. The Squad will also provide gymnasts and coaches the opportunity to work together to share ideas and training techniques. In 2010 there may also be the opportunity to extend the program to include a Level 3/4 Development Squad.





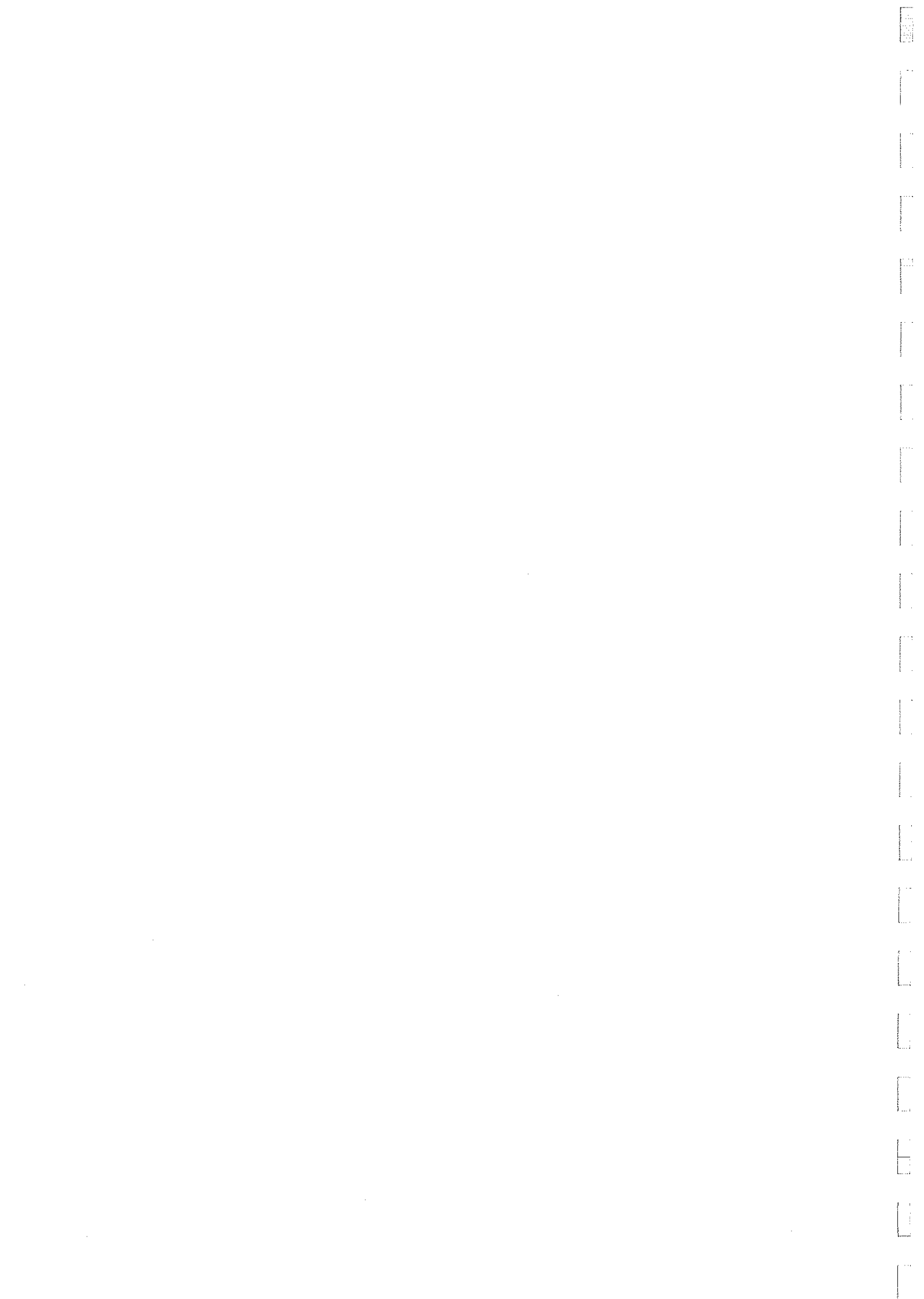
