PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Gymnastics Tasmania continues to move forward with an increasing number of athletes and officials, a new state gymnastics centre and improved national competition results.

Highlights:

- Hosted the Trampoline National Clubs, the first national event held in Tasmania for 18 years. The event attracted 279 athletes from around the country
- Increase in athlete numbers from 3099 last year to 3170 in 2010 at end of September 2010. Athlete numbers at December 31st 2009 was 3501
- Olivia Burnet placing 3rd overall level 9 at Women's Nationals, and Tasmania sending a level 7 team, the first time in 5 years. Strong performances from the boys including 3rd place Sam Crean at level 7 High bar and Tasmania's 1st Level 8 team at Nationals
- Jack Penny placing 1st on double mini at indo pacific championships, and representing Australia at the world championships
- The opening of the State Gymnastics Centre
- 3 Tasmanian teams participating in the first ever Gym 4 life challenge in Bendigo
- The formation of Eastside Trampoline (taking over from Jumping Jacks) and Southern All Star Cheer and dance

2011 will mostly likely see some major change to Gymnastics Tasmania. Nicole Colev. our Club 10 officer for 8 years has decided to step down from her role to concentrate on her teaching work, family and her new cheerleading club. The other likely change is the Gymnastics Tasmania office being closed at the end of the year and relocated to the Gymnastics Australia office. If this is to go ahead, this would result in the redundancy of Gaylene Brockman who has been a tremendous employee, for the past 15 years, of the association.

On behalf of the Gymnastics Tasmania Board I would like to take this opportunity to sincerely thank Gaylene and Nicole for their commitment and services to Gymnastics Tasmania. On a personal note I would not have been able to perform my role as president with out the wonderful work of both Gaylene and Nicole.

This AGM will see Lisa Burnett stepping down from her role on the Gymnastics Tasmania Board. Lisa and the Burnett family have been strongly involved in gymnastics for the past 10 years. Thank you to Lisa for your commitment to the board, your knowledge of sport and insight into finances will be missed.

Once again I would like to thank, the board members, staff, committee members and volunteers that have helped Gymnastics Tasmania move forward this year and I look forward to working with you again next year

CLUB 10 OFFICER'S REPORT

The Club 10 role has been utilized extensively by clubs during 2010. Many clubs have been working towards achieving a Star 3 which is considered National Standard and we have had two new clubs affiliate. It is envisaged that the need for this role will continue throughout 2011.

Affiliation

The affiliation process continues to run smoothly. The affiliation package for 2011 will be developed shortly as it will need to take into account changes within staff and process for Gymnastics Tasmania. One major change for 2011 is that all clubs will be required to register their athletes using Gymnastics Online. There are currently only two clubs; Wynyard Gymnastics Club and Wildcats Gymnastics Club; that will need to adjust to this change. This is to ensure all clubs are familiar with the online system in preparation for this system being utilized in the future for event and course entry.

Membership

All clubs will fall under the flat fee system in 2011. The PCYCT agreement is being terminated at the request of Hobart PCYC who are restructuring the program that their club currently offers. The impact of this on Launceston PCYC is expected to be minimal due to the make up of their athlete registration.

2010 membership packages were distributed late due to the folding of the company that make our year badges. This occurred after the order had been placed and we were not informed until early 2010 which in turn caused the delay in distribution.

Star Categories

Our clubs maintained their star ratings this year. Devonport Gymnastics Club, Wild Cats Gymnastics Club, Eastside Trampoline Club, Southern All Stars Cheer & Dance and Slipstream Circus have all made progress towards achieving star 3. Eastside and Southern All Stars were involved in the pilot project of G-Checklist which will see the checklist move into an online resource tool.

Policies and Procedures

The operational plan has been reviewed and is being implemented. Other policies and procedures have been reviewed throughout the year.

Calendar

The 2011 Calendar has been developed by Gaylene Brockman this year. Disciplines were required to electronically submit their calendars and this has been collated into one calendar which will be submitted to the board for approval at the conclusion of the 2010 AGM.

Grant Activities

As the Sport and Recreation Tasmania grant was successful in 2008 in achieving triennial funding, it was not necessary to write a full submission in 2010. There has been a change in the grant process and as a result I applied for and was successful in attaining some additional funding. When the grant is submitted in 2011 Gymnastics Tasmania will fall into the tier one category based on the criteria as we have seen an increase in our registrations.

I have not submitted any other grant applications on behalf of Gymnastics Tasmania this year.

Again there were over 50 entries from clubs around the State and Victoria, with strong contingents from Devonport, Kingborough and PIT, and entries from Hobart Gymnastics Academy, Hobart PCYC and Launceston PCYC.

Kingborough took out the Shell Shield for overall champion club and individual honours were shared round.

The Championships ran smoothly thanks to the efforts of the experienced team from Kingborough, particularly key people including Gary Pitchford and Mark Moncur and the announcer: Ade Foster

National Championships

This year's team to Nationals comprised a team at Level 7 Open and individuals at Level 8 Open. Team management comprised John Hargreaves and Pauline Dittmann with Coach: Kyle Giles and Judges: Andrew Martin and John Hargreaves. It was disappointing that we didn't field a team at level 8 due to Ricky Maui being injured.

The most notable results were Sam Crean's 3rd on high bar and 5th on rings at level 7 and Brady Lillico's 5th on pommels at level 8. All gymnasts competed competently and justified their selection.

I am happy to report that all the team represented the State with great merit, both on the gym floor and outside. Kyle and Pauline are a good team and once again made an invaluable contribution to the event, and it was good to have Andrew Martin as part of our team this year.

Coaches Courses & Clinics

Coaches Congress and Clinic

Antoine Rizzo led the MAG Congress this year, with the usual coaches' workshop on the first day and clinic on the second. Both were well attended and Andre's experience with higher level club gymnasts was particularly relevant to our State. The Clinic in the new Kingborough facility was a great start to the year for our higher level gymnasts.

State Team Training

A training session for the State Team to Nationals was held at Kingborough on 26 June led by John Hargreaves and Kyle Giles.

Training Clinics

Andrew Martin has led monthly training clinics at Kingborough. The first, in September, was held over two days and was also a coaches workshop. Subsequently a clinic has been held in October and two more are proposed in November and December.

Andrew's energy and knowledge are already making an impact with the higher level boys and it is proposed to continue with the initiative in 2011 and perhaps extend it to include junior gymnasts.

The availability of Kingborough at reasonable cost is much appreciated, and will no doubt be an important element in the future development of MAG in the State.

Coordinator of Competition Judges – Janelle Chilcott

All competitions have run well so far this year with good numbers on panels, I don't think we have had less than two judges on panels this year which is always a good thing! We have lots of young promising judges coming through which is great to see. There have been occasions where we've had to get 'extra' judges from other clubs either to fill panels or to have senior judges on panels but so far this has worked with no real issues.

It was great to see Liv Burnett achieving her level 10 at State Club Championships, it's been a long time since we have had a gymnast at this level in the state so well done Liv!

The beginner judges courses were run by Mark Moncur this year, myself and Mark ran the intermediate and Helen Colaguri ran the Advanced. The courses had good numbers and it was great to see some new judges coming through.

After the courses this year we decided it would be beneficial to have a check list for all courses to help make the course run smoother and make sure all information is getting to the necessary people. I have been working with Alison to put this together, I have passed on to her all the information I require as a presenter and she will add to it and liaise with GT to get a good working document in place.

State Championships ran well again with 3 judges from Victoria coming down to assist. It was lovely to hear some great comments coming from these judges not only about the quality of some of the gymnasts but also about how great the atmosphere is at our competitions between judges, coaches and judges and clubs. This was great to hear!

Janelle Chilcott to be re-nominated for this position for 2011

Co-ordinator of Judge's Education – Alison Fletcher

Four WG Judges Courses were held in 2010. With the introduction of the Women's Gymnastics National Program 2009-2012 all existing judges were required to update. As such the courses were well attended.

Two WG Beginner Judges Courses were held, the first in Ulverstone on February 21st. This course was run by Victorian Course Presenter, Sue Caldwell. Of the seven attendees, all passed. A WG Beginners Course was also held, in Hobart on the 18th of April. The course was run by Mark Moncur and of the nineteen attendees, all passed.

The WG Intermediate, (WG 4-6), Judges Course was held in Launceston on the 27th-28th March and co-run by Mark Moncur and Janelle Chilcott. Of the thirteen attendees, eleven passed.

A WG Advanced, (WG 7-10), Course was held in Hobart on 6th-7th of March and run by Helen Colaguri, National Technical Director. Of the nine attendees, eight passed and one passed as an Intermediate.

Despite the success of each course, there were a number of administrative issues that require improvement and as such I would like to make the following recommendations for 2011:

1. A checklist is currently being developed outlining the administrative organisation required prior to a Judges Course being held, and the time-lines for the completion of each task. It needs to be determined whether the tasks are the responsibility of the Judges Education Coordinator or the GT Office.

2. Specific statistical information is fed back to the Judges Education Coordinator at the completion of each course to assist with reporting. This would include a breakdown of costs for each course, numbers attending, number of successful attendees, number of attendees updating compared to new attendees.
3. A contact email for each judge is collected at the end of each course. This information should be collated by GT and provided to the Judging Competition Coordinator to assist with communication regarding up-dating and competition rotations.
4. All Judges within the state should receive email information regarding upcoming courses. At this stage information is only going out to existing judges via clubs, a source that is not always reliable.

Tasmania's most successful national gymnastics championships in over 15 years
From the 4th to the 8th of July, the Challenge Stadium in Perth Western Australia, played host to the Australian Women's Artistic National Levels Championships. Tasmania was represented by its largest team in over 5 years with 6 gymnasts being selected to compete. Competing in the level 7 competition was Sarah Kaica, Rosa Miller, Georgina Osborn and Jessica Tanner from Kingborough Gymnastics Club (KGC) and Hannah Doody from Hobart Gymnastics Academy (HGA). Also from HGA, Olivia (Liv) Burnett competed in the level 9 competition.

Tasmania had its most successful National Championships in over 15 years with Liv Burnett achieving 3rd in the individual all around, 2nd on beam and 6th on floor. These results were based on scores that were gained over 2 days of competition. Liv also received the Carol Sussman Award. This is awarded to a National Level 7-10 gymnast at the championships for artistry in their floor routine. Judges at all qualifying sessions nominate and decide on the recipient of the award. Liv then gained a further award which recognised her 5 year involvement as a competing gymnast in the championships.

The level 7 team also competed well with Georgina and Rosa qualifying for finals. After the 2nd day of competition, Georgina placed 11th on vault.

Accompanying the team were coaches Danielle Berry and Janita Scott from HGA and Judge Sarah Calvert from KGC.

Competitions

Tasmanian athletes competed in a variety of local, interstate, national, and international events.

International

In 2010, six Tasmanian athletes nominated for a position on the Australian Team. Four Tasmanian athletes were chosen to represent Australia at the Indo-Pacific Championships (27 June-3 July) which were held in Kakegawa, Japan. The athletes selected to represent Australia at this event were Aidan Collins (Under 15), Hugh McConnell (Under 15), Jack Penny (Senior International), and Hugh Ross (17 years and over). Three Tasmanian officials were also selected, Jo Penny (Assistant Team Manager), Ben Kelly (Assistant DMT Coach) and Leigh Oswin (DMT Judge). The Tasmanian members of the Australian Team competed well, with Jack Penny defending his Senior International Indo-Pacific DMT title. He also placed 3rd in the Senior International SYN. Aidan Collins finished 3rd in the Under 15 Men's DMT and 2nd in the Under 15 Men's SYN event with Hugh McConnell. Hugh Ross finished 4th in the 17+ Men's DMT event.

In addition, two athletes were chosen to represent Australia at the World Championships (11-14 November) and World Age Competition (16-19 November) in Metz, France. The athletes selected to represent Australia at the World Championships were Jack Penny (Senior International); and for the World Age Competition were Matthew Gough (Under 19). Two Tasmanian officials were also selected, Jo Penny (Open Team Manager, Assistant Age Team Manager), and Ben Kelly (Age Team Coach).

International events attended by Tasmanian athletes are listed below.

National Championships

Tasmania sent 20 athletes to the Australian National Championships. The UTA Team once again secured the gold medal in Men's Elite Team's event, comprising of both South Australian and Tasmanian athletes. In addition to these achievements, Jack Penny defended his 2009 title by winning the Senior International Men's DMT competition, while Aidan Collins defended his Under 15 Men's DMT title also. The number of DMT athletes was lower this year due to an increase in minimum standard scores for this discipline. It is expected Tasmania will field more DMT representatives in 2011.

In addition, Squad Manager, Jo Penny, has requested that no late expressions of interest will be excepted in 2011 due to difficulties in planning travel and accommodation at such late notice. Clubs need to be more efficient in identifying potential team members (i.e., squad members) and distributing the information in a timely manner.

Local competitions

Trampoline Sports ran two State Championships in 2010. These were well supported with the State Age & Elite Championships in Hobart in July and the State Level Championships held in Launceston in August. A brief summary of these championships are below.

The award for Overall State Champions is presented at the State Level Championships each year and is awarded to the athletes who show consistency in performance over the year in interclub, state, interstate, national, and international events.

- Men's Double-Mini (Ludmila Vitesnikova Award) – Jack Penny

- Synchronised (Jo Penny Award) – Ebony Denhom & Blair Kirkpatrick

Trampoline Sports ran three Interclubs in 2010; the third Interclub which is being held in December and therefore will not be reported on here. Kingborough hosted their first Interclub, which was quite successful. There were a few seating issues, but nothing that could not be rectified with public access to the "cage" towards the back of the gymnastics centre. The use of two sets of Trampolines, however, was a great benefit with the Level 1 and Level 2 athletes competing on the in ground Trampolines.

As this was the first competition at Kingborough, it is important to note that all equipment was in excellent condition and the judging stands and areas were also set up well. The only issue was the length of the DMT run-up, being a little shorter than desired, thus preventing high quality Junior/Senior International competition. 2010 was also the first year Tumbling was held at the interclub level. This was well supported and held at the Kingborough and Launceston Interclubs. More education is needed to ensure the athletes entered into these competitions are fulfilling requirements adequately to ensure a high quality of standard.

A brief summary of all Interclub competitions are below.

Based on the first two Interclubs of 2010, the TRP SMC recommends that the venue hosting the Interclub be available for the two full days of competition, to ensure all four disciplines can be convened in a timely manner ensuring it is athlete friendly preventing as many clashes in timetabling as possible.

Due to recent, GA recommendations relating judging expectations at National Championship Qualifying events (e.g., sanctioned interclubs), a slight change in the way in which Interclubs are run in 2011 may occur with more age group interclubs being necessary.

2010 National Club Levels

Gymnastics Tasmania convened the 2010 National Club Levels Competition at the new Kingborough Sports Centre in August. The National Club Levels competition is a high profile event in the National Trampoline calendar, attracting competitors from every state. In 2010, the National Club Levels competition was the final and compulsory trial for the 2010 Senior World Championship Team, the final trial for the Australian Age World Championship Team, and the premier event for the discipline of Tumbling.

This was the first National event Tasmania has held since the 1987 National Age and Open Championships which was held at the Silverdome in Launceston. The organising committee of Mark Moncur, Jo Penny, Ben Kelly, Ludmila Vitesnikova, and Natasha Petrie, did an excellent job of hosting this championship. Special thanks to the clubs which supplied equipment to the event (Eastside, Kingborough, and Launceston), the feedback from the national community was excellent. Special thanks to the extras that helped to set up the venue, including High Flyers Club (WA) and to pull down the equipment, in particular Robertson Gym Club (QLD). The Kingborough Gym Club staff also did an excellent job in their tasks of helping to run this event and develop the circulars prior to the competition.

The following athletes won National Levels events at this competition – Matthew French (Level 4 DMT), Daniel Nykiel (Level 6 DMT), and Jack Penny (Level 9/10 TRP). Tasmania will once again be hosting this competition in 2011.

State Squads & Training Camps

The scores required for entry into the four tier Trampoline State Squad system were changed to reflect the new National Levels Program introduced in 2010 (see figure below). The goal of the State Squad system is to identify potential State Team athletes for the current year, as well as to provide extra training and competition experience to help promote and develop these talents to their full potential. The scores used to achieve membership to these squads will be under review for 2011 due to the introduction of time of flight into some events.



In 2010, three State Squad Trainings have been conducted, including the one at the 2010 Tasmanian Congress. An additional training will be conducted in December 2010. These trainings have a different focus depending on the squad attending and the time of the year. Each Squad Training aims to promote a balance on performance and skill development, as well as introducing some cross training, and the use of sessions to aid recovery.

In addition to the Squad Trainings, squad members are also invited to participate in interstate events organised on a combined club basis to help share the workload and costs associated with travel and accommodation to help increase their competitiveness through experience. These competitions are selected based on the quality of the competition and matched to the athletes in the squad system. The competitions attended in 2010 included the VIC Championships, QLD Championships, NSW Championships, SA Championships, and the UTA Challenge.

National Squads & TIS

In 2010, Jack Penny was part of the Senior National Squad for both Individual Trampoline and Double-Mini. In addition, Damien Axelsen was named as a transitional athlete in the Junior/Senior National DMT Squad. The 2011 National Squads have recently been released with Jack Penny again being named on the Senior National Squad for TRP and DMT, and Aidan Collins being named on the Junior National Squad for DMT. Hugh Ross has been identified as a transitional athlete in the National Squad for Junior/Senior DMT.

Gymnastics Tasmania was successful in obtaining an Elite Development Program through the TIS in 2010. This EDP was identified as a multi-tiered system with the original members divided into full scholarship and associate members. The original members included Jack Penny and Natalie Skinner as full scholarship holders, and Damien Axelsen, Aidan Collins, and Patrick Sauerwald as associate members. Due to Natalie relocating to South Australia, she was immediately dropped from this program. All other members received medical exams and musculoskeletal checks identifying areas needing improvement to enhance performance. This EDP also conducted two training camps with focus on competition preparation in the first 6 months of the year, utilising training at all three major Tasmanian training venues (e.g., ETC, KSC, LPCYC). The officials for the EDP Squad include Jo Penny (manager), Ben Kelly (coach), and Leigh Oswin (judge).

Prior to National Championships, the TRP EDP program was reviewed by the TIS and renewed based on the performances from the Indo-Pacific Championships. Given the retirement of Patrick in the first 6 months of the year, a new EDP squad was announced. This current squad consists of five members, including Jack Penny (full scholarship), Damien Axelsen, Aidan Collins, Matthew Gough, and Hugh McConnell. These athletes were selected based on competition results and on-floor behaviour at key events. Two more TIS EDP trainings have been conducted since this new induction, both leading into high profile events including National Championships and World Championships. The goal of the EDP is to access National Coach, Nikolay Zhuravlev for a visit in early 2011.

In addition to the EDP, the TIS have once again supported the Trampoline Sports athletes through the National Representatives Fund to assist in costs towards Indo-Pacific and World Age Competition.

Education

In recent years Leigh Oswin has committed to the education of the Trampoline Sports community in both coaching and judging. These courses will be held every year, with the expectation that the courses will alternate around the north-south centres every year to encourage an even development.

Coaching Courses

The Level One coaching course was run in May with 7 candidates hosted by Launceston PCYC. The Spotters Course was also conducted in conjunction with the State Team Training session in June 2010 with the state gaining a further 4 fully qualified spotters.

The Saulto bridging course was again run in conjunction with the coaches congress with a large number of coaches from across the state participating.

Judging Courses

2010 saw the roll out of the new Judging courses. Gymnastics Tasmania ran the Beginner course in March with 14 candidates – all passing and the majority going on to judging at interclub level.

The Advanced judging course was also run in March which saw the reaccreditation of our most experienced judges as well as new judges stepping up to the advanced level in a very challenging course. All 9 candidates passed the TRP, DMT and TUM disciplines.

The Intermediate and Intermediate Bronze courses in TRP, DMT and TUM were run in September with the majority of candidates passing both courses. Two candidates were awarded a Beginner qualification after failing to meet pass standards however it is recommended that with some practical judging experience they will be ready to pass the Intermediate course in 2011.

Through discussion with the G-Educate team at GA during the National Age Championships it was decided that it is not appropriate to combine the Intermediate and Intermediate Bronze courses into the one weekend for candidates. This will mean that in 2011 it is proposed that Gymnastics Tasmania run the Beginner, Intermediate and Intermediate Bronze Judging Courses for Trampoline Gymnastics. It is estimated that there will not be a demand for an Advanced Judges Course in 2011.

2011 – Looking ahead

The Tasmanian TRP SMC would like to acknowledge the contribution of Greg and Felicity Harvey to the sport of Trampoline in Tasmania. Greg and Felicity have been extremely influential in the development of the Eastside Trampoline Club, which is home to many of our state, national, and international champions. Without their enthusiasm for sport administration, Trampoline would have struggled to continue with the current level of success.

The SMC would like to acknowledge the introduction of Tumbling to our state programs and in particular the use of the GA rod floor for competition and training for 18 months. Having access to this equipment will help to increase participation and competition numbers in Tumbling. The contribution of Maggie Smolinski and her expertise in this area of Trampoline Gymnastics is also appreciated.

RHYTHMIC GYMNASTICS

COACHING

There are currently 4 accredited coaches in Tasmania, unfortunately only 3 are actively coaching within their respective clubs. The three active clubs: Kingborough, HGA and Hobart PCYC all have trainee coaches working within their Rhythmic programs who will hopefully continue on to gain their RG Level 1 Coaching accreditation in the future.

Several RG workshops and a gymnast clinic were run at the Coaches Congress in January by Bridget Thomson from Victoria. These sessions were attended by coaches/gymnasts from Kingborough and HGA.

JUDGING

A Beginner Judges Course was run by Barbara Smith from WA in conjunction with State Championships in August this year, with 9 participants attending representing all 3 clubs. Due to time constraints participants are still required to complete some practical judging components before receiving their judging accreditation but, once this is completed, will give a much needed and long overdue boost to the number of judges within the state and will dramatically reduce the time required to complete National Award Tests.

EVENTS

Most competitions and National Award Tests this year have been well supported, with the exception of the first Level 4+ Competition which was cancelled due to insufficient entries. This was mostly due to the delayed release of the new 2010-2013 Manual and the large number of changes to routine and judging requirements.

State Championships were held in conjunction with MAG/WAG again this year and is still a very positive way of promoting Rhythmic within the community and allowing gymnasts the opportunity of a larger scale competition. The competition ran smoothly this year and was a very enjoyable event. We were extremely thankful to visiting judge Barbara Smith from WA, who voluntarily attended the event, making the judging a much easier process. The only negative is in the form that the Scoremaster program no longer suits the needs of RG judging, as it doesn't cater for the 3 areas of Difficulty, Artistry and Execution. Much thanks to all those who were involved in the organization of this event, and those who worked tirelessly on the day.

With the possible inclusion of interstate gymnasts in 2011 the competition format and floor space will need to be looked at, but I am sure a satisfactory outcome can be achieved.

To the best of my knowledge and belief, there has been no contravention of auditor independence and any applicable code of professional conduct in relation to the audit.


Limitation of Scope




